

Did you know?

- Spokane is the capital of the Intermountain Northwest. It is an urban oasis in that vast space between the Cascades and the Rockies. The word “Spokane” means Children of the Sun.
- The State of Washington is the 18th largest State with an area of 71, 362 square miles. Washington is the biggest producer of apples, hops, pears, red raspberries, spearmint oil and sweet cherries. The landscape of the entire State is that of elegance and beauty!
- Spokane is the home of 120+ parks, 76 lakes, 20+ wineries and over 46 breweries.
- Spokane will be your gateway to photographic opportunities in any direction you wish to travel. Spokane is only ½ day trip or a one-day trip to many beautiful destinations such as Glacier National Park, Mt. Rainier National Park, Olympic National Park, and a mere 472 miles from Yellowstone National Park. Spokane is also only 36 miles from scenic Coeur d’Alene, Idaho where we will be featuring photographic tours.
- Spokane is the home of Gonzaga University and Whitworth University.
- The hotel site for the PSA Conference is located at Riverfront Park and the Spokane Falls. You will be able to do all types of photography at any time or on any day!

Riverfront Park and the Spokane Falls

When people think Spokane, they think Riverfront Park. From the thundering Spokane Falls to the towering, historic Great Northern Clocktower to the hand-carved Loeffl Carrousel, the sprawling 100-acre campus is home to many of the region’s most iconic attractions.

Scenic Beauty

The Spokane River flows through the heart of Riverfront Park and the area serves as a showcase for the water’s natural beauty and power. One of the best ways to enjoy Riverfront Park is to explore the scenic trail system. The 40-mile paved Centennial Trail travels through the park, allowing walkers, joggers and bikers to explore the Spokane River for miles in either direction. For a short sojourn, take the trail west from the park. After you cross Post Street, the trail dips below the Monroe Street Bridge for a spectacular view of the lower falls. ■
